<b>Teaching Methods</b>	Teaching methods used in this course are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Bed side teaching</li> <li>- Pre-post conference</li> <li>- Reflective study</li> <li>- Nursing Round</li> <li>- One-Minute Preceptorship (OMP)</li> <li>- Case Based Discussion</li> </ul> <p>The class size for lecture is approximately 100 students, therefore there are 7-11 students for each lecturer</p> <p>Clinical fieldwork is 93,33 hours.</p>

<b>Content</b>	<p>Students will learn about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Application of the caring concept</li> <li>- Assessment procedures (anamnesis, physical assessment, and TTV)</li> <li>- Fingernail and toenail care procedures</li> <li>- Mobilization and ambulation procedures</li> <li>- O2 therapy procedures (cannulas, masks, etc.)</li> <li>- Personal care procedures: personal hygiene (bathing, shampooing, oral hygiene, vulva hygiene, etc.)</li> <li>- Procedure for installing a NGT and feeding via NGT, feeding via oral route</li> <li>- IV catheter installation and maintenance procedures, helping patients defecate using a bedpan</li> <li>- Simple wound care procedures</li> <li>- Medication procedures</li> <li>- Venous blood collection procedure</li> <li>- Suction procedures (oral and nasal) and chest physiotherapy/Oxygenation</li> <li>- Providing simple education/learning to clients/individuals</li> <li>- Implementation of therapeutic communication (creating an implementation strategy/SP)</li> <li>- Preparation of ASC based on basic nursing cases</li> <li>- Fulfillment of patient ADLs</li> <li>- Fulfillment of sleep and rest needs</li> <li>- Procedure for maintaining temperature (compress)</li> <li>- Fulfillment of psychosocial needs</li> <li>- Fulfillment of Universal Precaution needs</li> </ul>

<b>Study and examination requirements</b>	<p><b>Study and examination requirements:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Students must be present 15 minutes before the activity begins, if students are late, they are required to report to the supervisor.</li> <li>- The presence of students must be 100%</li> <li>- Students are not allowed to leave the practice site except with the permission of the supervisor</li> <li>- All the assignments and log book must be collected a maximum of 1 week after the nursing management practice takes place.
